Psychodynamic theory was formulated primarily as an attempt to explain impulsive self-injury in adolescent (and adult) populations with comorbid personality and affective disorders.³⁹ It is based on the self-disclosures of individuals with a history of self-injurious behavior and, to a greater extent, on the interpretation of these self-reports by professionals charged with providing treatment.
