If the mediation is not successful for whatever reason, an accredited Family Dispute Resolution practitioner can issue a certificate to allow an application to be made to a family law court. The certificate is called a 'Section 60I certificate' and can only be issued by an accredited Family Dispute Resolution practitioner.

(aa) a certificate to the effect that the person did not attend family dispute resolution with the practitioner and the other party or parties to the proceedings in relation to the issue or issues that the order would deal with, because the practitioner considers, having regard to the matters prescribed by the regulations for the purposes of this paragraph, that it would not be appropriate to conduct the proposed family dispute resolution;

If one parent refuses to go to Family Dispute Resolution (mediation) or doesn't show up, the Family Dispute Resolution Practitioner (mediator) may give you a certificate that says this. The Affidavit - Non-Filing of Family Dispute Resolution Certificate is available on the Family Court's website at www.familycourt.gov.au. In the Federal Circuit Court, you must either: prepare and file an Affidavit - Non-Filing of Family Dispute Resolution Certificate or, include this information in the affidavit filed in support of your application.

You should ensure that that affidavit also sets out those matters which you rely upon to file your applications without filing a certificate from a family dispute resolution practitioner. You do not need to complete this affidavit if there is a consent order or if you are applying for orders in response to an application.
