Language and linguistic performance are central aspects in identity shaping processes, whether the linguistic performance in question is deliberate or not. Language is part of human identity and the linguistic culture to which individuals belong influences how identity is perceived.

The term linguistic variation (or simply variation) refers to regional, social, or contextual differences in the ways that a particular language is used. Variation between languages, dialects, and speakers is known as interspeaker variation. Variation within the language of a single speaker is called intraspeaker variation .

### **Definition and Examples of Linguistic Variation**

A significant construct in language learning research, identity is defined as "how a person understands his or her relationship to the world, how that relationship is structured across time and space, and how the person understands possibilities for the future". Recognizing language as a social practice, identity highlights how language constructs and is constructed by a variety of relationships.

Linguistic variation and the construction of identity <ul><li>In some situations, speakers may choose not to converge, but instead either to maintain their own variety ( linguistic maintenance), or move to a more extreme variety of their dialect (linguistic divergence ). </li></ul><ul><li>The question of group affiliation and identity can determine the choices a speaker makes out how to speak, and for the bilinguals or multilinguals, which language to use.

This doctoral dissertation reports a study of language variation and identity conducted in Sunderland. The City of Sunderland, in North-east England, is situated about 15 miles to the south of Newcastle. As a result of this proximity to the dominant urban centre in the region, Sunderland people are often identified by outsiders as 'Geordies' and their dialect as 'Geordie'.
