The binder is a long narrow strip of cloth with which the Torah is bound, either on top of the wrapper or directly on the parchment. Its purpose is to keep the scroll securely bound when not in use. In Italy and in the Sephardi communities, the binder is known as a fascia ; it is made of a costly material or of linen embroidered in silk thread.

Torah Ornaments

The earliest Torah ornaments are the Torah crown and the finials mounted on the Torah case or on the staves of the Torah scroll. We first hear of a Torah crown in the 11 th century, in a responsum of *Hai Gaon concerning the use of a crown for a Torah scroll on *Simḥat Torah .
